

Vietnam breaks records in international tourism Is it time to book your trip?

Vietnam the new Southeast Asian tourism titan? Bold plans revealedaims to draw as many as 23 million international tourists this year, a goal that would surpass pre-pandemic levels, according to a statement on the government website.BMI Research expects the country's tourism industry to fully recover in 2025, it said in a report. Vietnam is targeting a 31% jump in foreign travellers this year from 2024, and about 5 million more than the 18 million arrivals in 2019. Visitors from India reached 501,000 in 2024. In the last two years, Indian tourists to Vietnam rose 2.6 times, making it "one of the most impressive growth markets" for Vietnam, according to the government statement. The number of international visitors to Vietnam reached 17.5 million last year, up 39.5% from 2023, according to the statement. Visi tors from within Asia accounted for about 80% of international travelers. The government said in June that it aims to make tourism one of the key industries to boost the country's economic growth.Before the pandemic, tourism accounted for about 12% of the nation's gross domestic product, according to a separate June statement, which cited a VinaCapital Group Ltd. report. International tourism repre sented 8% of the GDP.

The best way to reach Gulmarg is to take a flight to Srinagar and then travel 60km further by road.Auli, UttarakhandAll eyes are on Auli as it is set to host the National Winter Games, starting January end. The ski slopes here begin at an altitude of 3,000m and extend for 3km, featuring a vertical drop of 500m.



Heavy snowfall hits Sikkim—What it means for your travel plans

Snowfall shuts down Nathula and Tsomgo Lake in Sikkim: Is it time to rethink your trip? The upper reaches of Sikkim experienced heavy snowfall, an official said on Wednesday. The snowfall on Tuesday evening also led to a sharp dip in temperatures in the Himalayan state. According to the official black ice has formed at ThuloKhola, making the road to Nathula and Tsomgo Lake dangerous for vehicles. Efforts are underway to clear the snow but it will take a day or two to ensure safe passage, the official said. Permits for visiting Nathula and Tsomgo Lake will not be issued by the Tourism department until further notice. Travellers are advised to stay updated on the situation and exercise caution. The administration is monitoring the weather and road conditions closely, the official added.
