

Vande Bharat trains will run on Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train corridor until Shinkansen trains

New Delhi: After facing uncertainty and delay over the procurement of high-speed trains from Japan, the Indian Railways announced that Vande Bharat trains will run on the Mumbai-Ahmedabad high-speed corridor until the arrival of the Japanese Shinkansen trains. At a time the tender for procuring trains with Shinkansen technology from Japan for running at a maximum speed of 320 kmph is yet to be firmed up, Indian Railways said it is actively considering running an Indian Bullet train with a maximum speed of 280 kmph on the 508 km long Mumbai-Ahmedabad high-speed rail corridor. The Indian Railways said the decision comes amid delays in finalising the deal for procuring the Shinkansen trains, which are now expected to be operational in stages by 2030 and fully by 2033.In the meantime, the National High-Speed Rail Corporation (NHSRCL) has invited tender for a signalling system that will enable Vande Bharat trains, with a maximum design speed of 280 km/h, to operate on this section. The European Train Control System (ETCS) Level-2 will be implemented for the Vande Bharat trains, while the Japanese DS-ATC signalling system will be installed for the Shinkansen trains once they arrive. The Railways said that the plan is to start fully-functional operations of Vande Bharat trains on this track by 2027.

US plans to remove H-1B visa country cap: Will this benefit Indian professionals?

President-elect Donald Trump has named well-known Indian-American venture capitalist Sriram Krishnan as Senior Policy Advisor for Artificial Intelligence at the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy, a historic appointment that indicates growing influence of Indian-Americans in US politics. Paris to Milan in just 6 hours: Highspeed train service resumes for tourists after 19-month closure due to landslide

The train line connecting Paris with Turin and Milan will reopen in late March and early April after a landslide caused a 19-month closure. The hugely popular train line linking Paris with the Italian cities of Turin and Milan is to reopen in March and April after a 19-month closure forced when a landslide damaged a tunnel, French railway operator SNCF and Italian counterpart Trenitalia announced Tuesday. SNCF said connections between Paris and Turin and Milan, which has whisked passengers from a breakfast of croissants in the French capital to a hearty pasta for lunch in Italy in six or seven hours, would resume on March 31. Trenitalia, which is competing with SNCF on the line, said its connections would resume on April 1. France-Italy train services resumes The Italian company plans two round trips per day aboard its high-speed Frecciarossa train. SNCF will offer three round trips per day on the French TGV. The French company set up a replacement service between Paris and Milan last January in order to keep one round trip per day.
